

Context

The "European Capital of Culture" programme highlights Europe's cultural richness and diversity, celebrates the common cultural elements of European citizens, contributes to increasing the sense of belonging of European citizens to a common cultural space, and promotes the contribution of culture to the development of cities. The programme has proven over time that it plays an important role in regenerating the cities, expanding their international profile, increasing the sense of confidence and pride of their inhabitants about the values that underlie its development, revitalising the cultural sector, and stimulating tourism.

For the cities holding the title, the opening event is an opportunity to demonstrate artistic excellence, the European dimension, and public participation in the events proposed in the cultural programme. It is also an excellent opportunity to present events from the cultural programme designed for the whole year, which will showcase its diversity, outline some strategic thematic areas on which it is built, and foreshadow its legacy.

In the case of Opening Timișoara 2023, the organisational role of the Center for Projects was outlined around the following strategic directions:

- creating, aside from the "traditional" calendar of events, reasons to come (unmissable moments) essential for profiling the city as a destination at regional, national, European, and international levels;
- programming elaborately produced events with a large audience in the public space, intended to send positive signals to the Romanian event industry and the international area, confirming the presence of Timişoara in the artist's booking circuit, the inauguration of new spaces for cultural and artistic projects, and the strengthening of strategic partnerships;
- challenging both the inhabitants of Timișoara and its visitors to live and imagine new ways, rhythms, and times to experience the city.

In the context of this strategic approach and through collaborations and meetings between international and Romanian artists, we managed to convey from Timișoara to Europe and the whole world that solidarity, courage, and an open society offer relevant answers in times of hopelessness, social division, and ecological challenges.



Programme

Under the approach *Opening Timișoara 2023: one weekend for a year!*, the programme brought together **over 130 events distributed throughout the city**. The Opening of Timișoara 2023 meant memorable performances, brave art, ideas that open the world, visitors from all over Europe and open communities.

From the first day of the Opening, the public could enjoy a **string of exhibitions that were open for several months**, some even until the end of the year:

- Central collective exhibition Chronic Desire Sete Cronică (17 February -23 April);
- Mircea Nicolae Small Things, Precious Things (17 February 23 April);
- You Are Another Me A Cathedral of the Body (17 February 30 April);
- Victor Brauner: Inventions and Magic (17 February 28 May);
- New Times: Xenogenesis of SF (17 February 2 April);
- Ritzi Jacobi & Peter Jacobi. Textures of Memory. Works from five decades (17 February – 5 May);
- Made up histories have long lives (17 February 16 April);
- Bright Cityscapes: Mirroring the ecosystem (17 February 2 April);
- Minitremu 10+ (17 February 4 December);
- Installation The Nursery. 1306 Plants for Timișoara (18 February December).

One should note that the exhibitions inaugurated during the Opening continued to attract large audiences in the following weeks, proving to be focal points for various audiences. The central collective exhibition *Chronic Desire – Sete Cronică* and the exhibition *Mircea Nicolae - Small Things, Precious Things* have attracted **16,836 visitors** to date, while *You Are Another Me – A Cathedral of the Body* has been visited by around **2,000 guests**. After receiving **more than 6,000 guests** during the Opening weekend, the exhibition *Victor Brauner: Inventions and Magic* continues to attract hundreds of visitors week after week, also receiving encouraging feedback in the international press. The estimated audience figures for other exhibitions are: **2,833** (*Minitremu 10+*), **1,115** (*Bright Cityscapes: Mirroring the Ecosystem*), **3,700** (*Made up Histories Have Long Lives*) and **2,728** (*New Times: Xenogenesis of Sci-Fi*). *The Nursery. 1306 Plants for Timişoara* has been visited by **23,569 people** so far and has already hosted several events.

Friday evening culminated with the festive moment **We Celebrate the Opening**! in Union Square, during which Timișoara was awarded the **Melina Mercouri award** from the European Commission. The award is a recognition of the effort made by the city on its way to this title, equally celebrating the artistic independence and cultural diversity that characterise the national cultural programme "Timișoara - European Capital of Culture 2023". According to the official estimates of the "General Moise Groza" Timis County Gendarmerie Inspectorate, **the number of spectators in Union Square reached the threshold of 17,000 people.**

The Opening of Timişoara 2023 was a celebration of the entire city. Through the **Opening+** programme, run by the Center for Projects, from amounts allocated from the state budget through the Ministry of Culture, **25 new cultural projects** proposed by the local community joined the programme of this intense weekend. They were full of the fresh energy of the city, reflecting its entire diversity, and took the celebration to the neighbourhoods, from losefin to Soarelui and from Fabric to the Campus or Plopi.

This weekend was just the beginning of an unrepeatable year that will highlight the best that Timișoara has to offer through the values that contributed to its construction: innovation, multiculturalism, and diversity.

Structure

Based on the vision developed by the members of the curatorial team, who ensured not only the content direction but also the production supervision for a festive exploration route of the Timișoara 2023 Cultural Programme, the Opening was built from **3 types of events and projects:**

- those developed especially for this event by the curatorial team and organised directly by the Center for Projects of the Municipality of Timișoara;
- components of the Cultural Programme from the application file, organised by operators and "host" cultural institutions of the Timișoara 2023 Cultural Programme;
- projects selected as a result of the Opening+ financing programme, run by the Center for Projects of the Municipality of Timișoara with funds from the state budget, through the Ministry of Culture.

In the preparation for the opening event, special attention was paid to cultural production, and the first step in this direction was to identify the appropriate spaces and destinations for each type of event programmed. In the process of choosing the public space for the celebration in Union Square, collaborators who offered consultancy in crowd management were co-opted; their recommendations grounded the decision to remove a string of elements from the square and the adjacent streets, which could have represented a danger, especially in case of an emergency evacuation during the event. This decision proved extremely valuable in ensuring the comfort and safety of the public in the square and avoiding any incidents.

Establishing a command centre and group at the level of local and national authorities facilitated the taking of appropriate and essential decisions for the successful organisation of the event, both at the level of the protocol imposed by the presence of high dignitaries and at the level of public safety. The command group will remain active throughout the year and will be notified monthly of the list of events taking place, marking those that require increased attention from local and national authorities.

The success of the opening is due to the teamwork and commitment of the volunteers, the collaboration between the Center for Projects, the TM2023 Association, the cultural operators, and the local and national public authorities who contributed to its organisation.

Following this genuine effort of coordination and cooperation, a series of conclusions and recommendations were formulated to optimise the approval system, public and inter-institutional communication, coordination with the HORECA and business sectors, and the processes of handing over and taking over the sites in the protected area.

Communication

The Opening of Timişoara 2023 benefited from a dedicated bilingual subsite (*landing page*) (deschiderea.Timişoara2023.eu / opening.Timişoara2023.eu), developed, populated and managed by the team of the Center for Projects and hosted on the Timişoara2023.eu domain, managed by Association Timişoara 2023 – European Capital of Culture. For increased efficiency, the strategy and communication tactics corresponding to the Opening were implemented in coordination and synchronization with the association team.

This visual and verbal identity, derived from the general identity of the Timişoara 2023 programme, has been translated into a string of promotional materials intended for the digital environment and digital supports (graphics, presentation films, animations), as well as promotional materials or signage elements (posters, leaflets dedicated to the programme of events, leaflets for exhibitions, postcards, stickers, banners, meshes, badges, bags and other materials).

The press centre, operated in coordination with the team of the Timişoara 2023– European Capital of Culture Association, operated for four days and accredited 180 journalists from the local, national, and international press. According to media monitoring by MediaTrust, in the



period close to the Opening 1-28 February 2023, there were 8,223 mentions of the Timişoara 2023 – European Capital of Culture programme in the national media and social media, with a cumulative audience of **101,000,000 people**, distributed locally (21.5%), and respectively nationally (78.6%). **The advertising equivalent of these appearances (AVE) is 4,260,000 lei (869,387 euros)**, distributed as follows: press - 287 thousand RON, radio - 63.2 thousand RON, TV - 2,310 thousand RON, social media - 624 thousand RON, informative portals – 984 thousand RON).

In terms of promotional campaigns, we chose the following channels with high exposure: *Google Ads Search, Google Ads Display, Youtube Ads, and Meta Ads* (both on *Facebook* and *Instagram*). Second, we focused on alternative platforms, where we identified our target audience: *Tik Tok, Pinterest, Reddit, and Huawei Ads*. Last but not least, *programmatic ads* were used to diversify ad formats and gain exposure on a list of premium content platforms.

70% of the entire digital communication budget of the Opening was directed to the *Google* and *Meta* platforms to accommodate the reach of large audiences. The rest of the budget was mostly allocated to *Tik Tok*, which is now the third social media platform in Romania in terms of number of users, after *YouTube* and *Facebook*. About 10% of the budget was directed to *programmatic media* to ensure a priority visibility, and the rest of the budget went to alternative platforms that helped a lot in terms of interaction and providing additional meeting points with the target audience.

According to the report of the specialised company Mavericks, which handled the implementation of digital campaigns, we obtained a total of **18,800,000 impressions** of all campaigns carried out in a period of about two weeks. We also redirected 250 thousand clicks from the campaigns, thus obtaining an **average click rate of 1.33%**, above the reference average of 1% on some platforms. We obtained a number of over **2,300,000 views** and **32,000 engagements** also from the campaigns.

The page dedicated to the Opening programme had **72,600 visitors**, while the homepage that summarized the information had **153,100 visitors**.

The most visited other pages on the dedicated website, **<u>deschiderea.Timisoara2023.eu</u>**, were:

- The page dedicated to the important moments of the Timişoara 2023 programme (18,600 visitors);
- The page dedicated to Chronic desire Sete Cronică central exhibition (4,900 visitors);

- The page dedicated to the Taraf de Caliu concert (4,300 visitors);
- The page dedicated to the *Victor Brauner: Inventions and Magic* exhibition (4,200 visitors);
- The page dedicated to the Implant pentru Refuz concert (3,200 visitors).

According to the traffic statistics provided by the Fathom Analytics platform, the dedicated bilingual site was visited in the close period January 15 – February 22, 2023, by more than **244,000 unique visitors**, totalling more than **488,400 visits**. Apart from Romania, the countries most interested in the site content were Germany, Austria, France and the United States of America.

In the extended period January 1, 2023 – March 1, 2023, in which communication was centred on the Opening, the impact on Timișoara 2023 Facebook and Instagram pages was **1,913,938 people** and **113,311 people**, respectively. The audience for the Facebook communication channel was represented by 83% Romanians, 37% being from Timișoara. Demographically, the audience was 60% female and 40% male, with the 25-54 group making up around 80%. For Instagram, 75% of the audience was from Romania, 38% from Timișoara, 66% women, 34% men, and the 25-54 group represented around 85%.

Inclusion and accessibility

The Opening of Timișoara 2023 – European Capital of Culture (17-19 February) was an inclusive event, a celebration for the entire community. In this spirit, multiple measures have been taken to increase the degree of accessibility of the spaces and events in the programme.

A metal podium was installed in front of the stage, equipped with support bars and a ramp that facilitates the visibility of the stage for people using wheelchairs; a safe space for people with other types of disabilities was also ensured.

For the first time in Timișoara, the hearing-impaired people in the audience benefited from the artistic interpretation of the concerts in Union Square. Thus, on Friday, 17 February, between 19:25 and 22:00, Lavinia Chițu, one of the few concert interpreters in Romanian sign language, was on stage alongside the artists, and translated the lyrics and played the rhythm of the music so that hearing impaired people to be able to enjoy a memorable show.

The central collective exhibition of the Opening of Timișoara 2023, *Chronic desire – Sete Cronică*, is hosted in a space accessible to people with disabilities at the "Maria Theresia" Bastion (the building towards the Faculty of Medicine). Facilities include barrier-free routes from the Cardinal Points and Continental Hotel, a barrier-free entrance, and an adapted toilet. Also, visitors with disabilities to the multimedia exhibition *You Are Another Me – A Cathedral of the Body* by Adina Pintilie at Kunsthalle Bega can use the access elevator to the 1st floor of the building.

In front of **Cinema Victoria** (2 Ciprian Porumbescu St.), where exceptional European films and animations for children were screened during the Opening weekend, parking spaces are reserved for people with disabilities, the entrance to the cinema is barrier-free, it has a ramp, and there is also an adapted toilet.

Faber Cultural Center (4-5 Peneș Curcanul Splai), where the exhibition *Bright Cityscapes: Mirroring the Ecosystem* was inaugurated during the Opening weekend, is a space with barrier-free access, also equipped with an adapted toilet.

The Water Museum / Water Treatment Station (Calea Urseni) awaited its participants on January 18 and 19, with workshops for children and young people and guided tours. Two of the industrial heritage buildings have entrances and barrier-free sightseeing routes, and the newly built pavilion is equipped with an adapted toilet.

Facilities at the **Basca Theatre**, where the performance "Zambara Kabarett" took place on Sunday, February 19, include a mobile ramp and support to access the performance hall.

The New Millennium Reformed Church, where the chamber concert by Kosztándi Quartet from Hungary took place on February 19, at 18:00, has a barrier-free entrance.



Echoes and testimonials

In this section, we present selections from specialised and general public reactions to some of the key moments of the programme and the reverberation of the opening event throughout the community.

As can be seen from the numerous articles published in the national and international media, Timișoara has reconfirmed its vocation as an art host in a moment of synchronisation with biennales and important museums from around the world.

The collective exhibition *Chronic desire – Sete Cronică* proposes, in multiple spaces in the city ("Maria Theresia" Bastion, Timișoara Garrison Command, "Corneliu Miklosi" Museum of Public Transport, Ștefania Palace), new ways of reading and feeling the critical political and ecological moment that we are crossing together.

We present below some extracts from both the curators' reports and the education and mediation events coordinated by the "Contrasens" Cultural Association for the *Chronic desire - Sete Cronică* exhibition spaces, accompanied by press feedback.

"...for me, the most interesting part is that from all the conversations I have had so far with visitors, I have not yet found any negative opinions related to the project, although I expected (before starting the mediation activity) to be able to determine a percentage of visitors who do not appreciate the exhibition. That didn't happen. On the other hand, many things happened that I did not expect.

One of them is how many families with children come to this exhibition. I've had incredibly various experiences with every family that's come here, but there hasn't been one child who hasn't been excited about what's going on around him, in a very curious and healthy way."

"Most people who visit us come in groups of two or more persons, and the part of great interest for most of them is room 3, the VR room."



The exhibition *Mircea Nicolae – Small things, precious things* (Garrison Command Timișoara) brought back to public attention a prominent figure of contemporary art in Romania. Under the pseudonym Mircea Nicolae, artist Ionuț Cioană (1980–2020) had a diverse and extensive trajectory; he imagined curatorial formats that tested institutional limits and was one of the most talented art critics of his generation.

Between February 18 and March 17, the installation was visited by 23,569 people.

Apart from being an exhibition in itself and a space to contemplate the biodiversity of the urban space, the Nursery is also an alternative location for city events. Thus, OAR Timiş launched a call inviting cultural operators to propose events in various formats (shows, thematic workshops, micro-exhibitions, debates, launches) that can be hosted in the Nursery.



Timișoara's vocation as the capital of contemporary art was also confirmed by the exhibition *Victor Brauner: inventions and Magic*, financed by the Timiș County Council and co-organised by the National Museum of Art Timișoara, the Pompidou Centre in Paris, the Art Encounters Foundation and the French Institute in Romania, with works from both the National Art Museum of Romania and the French museums of Saint-Étienne and Cantini and Marseille, but also from the museums of Tulcea and Galați.

The central theme of opening the city to other cultures and forms of expression, as well as the celebration of its rebellious and revolutionary spirit, was supported by the selection of rock, hip-hop, Balkan/ethno, and electro music artists for the festive moment *We Celebrate the Opening!* The way in which these shows were interspersed in the programme of the opening event and translated the curatorial concept for the stage in Union Square is another step towards a series of events through which Timişoara can attract new categories of national and international audiences.

If there is a thread of reference that ties together the events that appear in the Timişoara 2023 opening programme, it is the desire to overcome the boundaries of creativity in the field of contemporary art and to discover the city, with the eye, ear or heart, in an authentic dialogue between countries and generations, genres and cultures, traditions and technologies.
